DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The King Farm is located on the western bank of the Little Elk Creek about sixty feet above the creek. The house or dwelling connected to this farm was built in two main sections. It is one half log and one half frame. The entire house is four bays long by two bays deep with a second story and attic. The eastern two bays are constructed of logs laid in saddle notch style very similiar to the Nonn Log House. This section has a cellar and the entire house has a stone foundation. In both gable ends is an inside end chimney the frame end chimney is built of brick while the log end is made of stones with a brick top that matches the more newer frame end chimney. In the log side are exposed beams that have a single bead on each edge. All the floors are new except for the attic floor. A break neck stair leads to the second floor. The frame section is of mortice and tenon construction. The exterior covering for the house consists of level siding. Although much of the early sash has been removed there are several windows with 6/6 sash. All the windows have lowered shutters. The gable roof has asphalt shingles and a plain box cornice.

Across the road from the house are the foundation ruins to a bank barn, a small shed and a wagon shed.
