DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Cherry-Janney House was originally built in three sections one, log, one stone, and one frame. The stone section was connected to the east gable wall and was taken down in the early 20th century. The remaining structure is a double house approximately (each side) two bays square. The eastern section appears to date from the 1830's and is built partially of a mortice and tenon frame. It has a side bay entrance on the facade. The roof for the entire house is a gable with return cornice. The window frames have caps and have 6/6 sash. The roof is covered with galvanized sheets of metal covering an earlier wood shingle roof. The other part of the house also has a side bay entrance and is two storeys in height. It is partially built of logs laid in saddle notch style. The house has a stone foundation and cellar. Across the facade is a one storey entrance porch. In the center of the house is a brick chimney.
