DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Child's Row #2 House is a fairly large double house built in the East Lake or Stick style of architecture. It is a frame dwelling three bays long by two bays deep with a two storey rear wing. The central bay of the facade has two entrances with transoms which are protected by a small one storey porch that runs from one two storey bay window to another. Between storeys of these windows are frame panels composed of boards nailed in diagonal patterns. The bay windows have hip like roofs with small peak-dormers over them with tri-paned windows. The roof of these dormers have tiny brackets supporting their eaves. The rest of the house has a gable roof with wood shingles. The bay windows due to the framing of the panels look like they are half timbered. The porch roof is supported by a central post and stick like brackets. Each side of the house has an interior brick chimney. The exterior of the house has weatherboard siding. The house has a fieldstone foundation and a cellar. The window sash is 2/2 and there are not any shutters on the house.

The house appears to be structurely sound and is in need of only exterior repair.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Child's Row #2 is one of a series of interesting Victorian structures that were built along Blueball Road during the hey day of the nearby Marley Mill. The house contributes to the streetscape of the village of Childs and is important for this reason. The house most likely served as a dwelling for mill workers for the mill. Due to the similarity in building style with other houses in the village the house might have been built and owned by the company. Since the decline of the mill the house has served as apartments for lower income tenants. The building is in need of repair.
