DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Childs' Corner House is a two and a half storey masonry building. It is a double house and could have been built in the mid 19th century. The house is four bays long by two bays deep and its exterior walls have been stuccoed. There are two entrances on the facade of the structure and one on the rear wall. On the front of the house is a two bay one storey entrance porch. The house has a hip roof which has new asphalt shingles. On each side of the roof is a gable roofed dormer. Protruding from the center of the roof is an interior brick chimney. The window sash are comparatively modern and consist of one pane over one. The house has a stone foundation and a cellar.

The interior of this house was not investigated and perhaps if done would reveal the true age of the structure.
