DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Stone Row #3 is actually a large frame building that is one building in a row of three structures the other two are made of stone. It is three stories in height and three bays long by two deep. Originally built in the late Greek Revival Period it has been altered somewhat to look more Victorian. The facade has a central entrance and a one story front porch. The house has weatherboard siding. In each gable wall is a brick inside end chimney. The gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

On the north gable end is a small two story section which I imagine was in addition. The original window sash has been removed from the house and the present sash consists of two panes over two.
