DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Tomlinson-Ford House is a large brick dwelling built in the mid to late 1800's. It was built in two sections. The earlier part is the western section of the house. It is three bays long by two deep and two and a half stories in height. There is an inside end chimney (of brick) in the east gable. On the roof is a single peaked dormer. A front porch extends across the facade and up the east gable. It is one story in height supported by round columns of wood with a handrail between columns. The main entrance is in the north western bay of the facade. This section has a stone foundation and a cellar. The roof has gingerbread along its edges. The window sash is 6/6. The bricks are laid in common bond. In the rear of this section is another chimney presumably used for the kitchen.

During the late 1800's a brick three story addition was built onto the east gable of the house roughly two bays by two bays. The bricks were laid in common bond with segmental arches over the windows. The frames were also arched at the top. The gable roof has a fireplace chimney in the south gable. It also has continuation of the gingerbread with pendants at the corners. On the eastern end of this section is a two story frame part which was at one time a bay window. It is now covered with woods.

In front of the house is a small brick springhouse built into the side of the hill.


