DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Loston Stone Tenant House is a building shaped like an "L". The front section (or foot of the "L") is built of stone, two stories in height and partially covered with stucco. In each gable wall is an inside end chimney built of brick. The stucco is pointed to look like ashlar. High in the south gable is an illegible date stone. The window and door frames are pegged together. The sash on the first stories is 6/9 and 6/6 on the second. Across the front is a three-bay single story porch. The roof has wooden shingles and a box cornice. Beneath the house is a cellar. This section of the house is bays long by two deep.

The rear section is frame also two story in height with gable roof. The eastern gable wall has an inside end chimney and midway in this wing is an interior chimney. The exterior walls have clapboard. The window sash is 6/9 on the first story and 6/6 on the second. The shingle (wood) has a box cornice.

On the north gable of the stone house is the outline of a roof which might have been to an earlier structure.

In the lawn are traces of brick walkways.
