DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is an early farmhouse constructed of logs with smaller frame additions. This building is one-and-a-half stories in height with a clapboard interior. In the south gable end is a very large end chimney which has a alrge fireplace with crane. There is a cellar underneath the original building. The main section is rectangularly shaped four bays long by two bays wide. Across the facade is a one-story end porch. To the rear of the central downstairs room is a leanto kitchen of turn of the century age. The cellar walls are constructed of stone and the floor is supported by massive log joists. On the left of the fireplace is a very narrow winding stairway. The logs are laid in saddlenotch style.

There are three outbuildings. A late 19th century carriage shed and barn stand to the south of the house, both are frame. Directly to the east of the house is a stone ruin. The exterior ways seem to be in good shape despite the fact that there is no roof.
