DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The McKeown Farmhouse is an L-shaped frame building with clapboard siding built in two different sections. The rear part of the house was moved to the present location from another part of the farm. At one time it was a one-story cabin two bays by two with a gable roof which could have pre-dated 1800. This wing was added to until it was five bays long and slightly less than two deep.

In the 1850's a member of the Bouldin family who was proposing marriage had to agree to build a front section onto the house prior to the wedding day. This front section is two stories in height, five bays long by two deep. In each gable end is a brick inside end chimney. The facade has a central bay entrance which opens into a central hall and staircase. On each side of this hall is a large room; the eastern most served for dining purposes while the west was a parlor.

Across the front of the house is a one-story porch. The front section has a gable roof covered with wooden shingles. The windows have caps on the frames and 6/6 sash. The first story windows have panelled shutters while the second floor has louvered shutters. The foundation is of stone and the house has a cellar below.

When the front section was built the original rear section had a second story added and a lower pitched roof was put on. This section became the kitchen and slave quarters. The one interior brick chimney divides the rear section. There are two rooms on each floor with an enclosed (board and batten) break neck stairway to the upper floor in each. This section has a stone foundation and a one-story porch on the east side.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This farm has been in the Bouldin family since the late 1600's. It has always served as a farm. The house is fairly typical of farm houses of the mid 1800's in Cecil County. Earlier structures have burnt including a row of log slave dwellings. During the Revolutionary War the family supposedly buried the family plate in the fields when the British landed at Oldfield's Pt. across the river. The silver has never been relocated.

The house is not in very good condition and possibly faces renovation in the near future.
