DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is built of fieldstone, two stories in height, two storie long and nearly two bays wide. In the east gable end is a brick chimney. The roof is gable with wood shingles and simple box cornice. The stones are partially covered by paint and stucco, but where visible seem to be laid in rough courses with stone quions at the corners. The walls are approximately 18' thick. The facade has a side entrance with a board and batten door. The window sash is 6/6 with plain frames. The interior was not open to inspection.

Next to and abutting the stone structure is a frame structure four bays long and just over one bay in width. It is two stories in height. It is covered with shingles (asbes). The window sash is 6/6 and similar to that in the stone house. This building mostlikely was constructed during the mid-19th century.

South of the house is the foundation of a large barn. Many timbers and some hinges and curiosities litter the site.
