This Stone House Ruin is located in Cecil County, within the Fair Hill N.R.M.A., off of the dirt access road. It is to the south of the Mason-Dixon line, to the east of Appleton Road, to the north of Maryland route 273, and to the west of Little Egypt Road. It is obscured by vegetation but is just over the bridge that crosses Appleton Road.

It appears that this was a two-story, "I"-shaped design, all fieldstone constructed house. Much of the structure has collapsed, although some portions of the fieldstone walls are intact. All the doors and windows are missing, but part of the brick chimney remains.



The Alexander Site is located on a ridge several hundred yards west of Appleton Road. The only remains of a large frame and log farmhouse are the foundation walls. The house site is believed to be an original Alexander homestead perhaps the home of Joseph Alexander or his son James. The building stood until several years ago.

It was two stories in height built in three different sections. The small log section was located in the rear of the main section.
