**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Milestone House is so named for the Mason Dixon Milestone located directly behind the structure. This building was built in two sections with the western end being the oldest. The present home is five bays long by two deep, but the original dwelling was two bays by two with an inside chimney in the east gable end (this chimney today is an interior chimney). The chimney is built of brick and most likely has been rebuilt. The old section could be either log or frame due to the thickness of the walls (a more thorough inspection is needed.) The house has a gable roof with wood shingles and a box cornice. The facade entrance is covered by an enclosed porch, but appears to be a side bay entrance. The exterior surface has been coated by stucco. The window sash is all 20th century as is the one story front porch.
