DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The C. W. Brown Tenant House is a two and a half story dwelling that was built in several stages. Due to the exterior coating of stucco it is nearly impossible to tell what the house is built of most likely it is either stone or brick. The east end of the house seems to be the original structure with an addition of two bays to the west making this home four bays long by two deep. At an even later date the rear wing was added which is two stories in height. The house has inside end chimneys built of brick in the west and east gable ends. The window frames have a segmental look to the top and have a 2/2 sash. In the center of the gable roof is a two window shed dormer.

Behind the house is a small one story frame building with board and batten siding which has a partial stucco covering. In the west end of this structure the gable is built around a large exterior stone and brick chimney. This building could have served as a work house in which lard was boiled down for soap making or barrels made for use on the near by farms.
