**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Old Methodist Rectory is a two story frame building three bays long by three bays deep. The house has a one story porch on the facade with chamfered support posts and curved brackets. The facade has a side bay entrance with transom. The windows beneath the porch have paneled shutters. The house has a gently sloping gable roof with asphalt shingles. The exterior of the rectory is covered with woods weatherboard siding. The window sash varies, it is 2/2 and 4/4. This building has a stone foundation and a one story rear addition with a shed roof.
