DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Terrell House is constructed of bricks laid in common bond on all walls except the facade which is laid in running bond. The house is three-bays long by two deep with a one-bay frame addition located to the rear of the structure. The bricks on the facade are much better than the other bricks used. The house has a stone foundation and full cellar. The slightly pitched gable roof is covered by asphalt shingles. It has a box cornice with brackets beneath. The entire structure is two-storeys in height. The addition has a shed roof and novelty siding. The facade has a one-storey, one-bay screened-in porch while there is a side entrance in the west gable wall which also has a small porch. On the facade, the windows have marble sills, and a segmental arch of bricks with a marble keystone over them. On other walls, wood is used instead of marble. The front part of the house consists of two large rooms with a large doorway between them. Behind these two rooms is a stair hall which leads from the side entrance. The stair is a straight single flight with closed string. The balusters are turned with a walnut handrail. Around all the doors and windows is architrave. Between the stair hall and the frame kitchen is a large dining room. There is a chimney in the frame section which most likely served for the kitchen stove. At one time, there inside end-chimneys which serviced corner stoves. The house has interior shutters both louvered and inset paneled. The house has pine flooring. Most of the window sash is 4/4. The majority of the doors are 4 panel.
