**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Squires House is a frame building two storeys in height, three bays long by two deep. It has a gable roof covered with asphalt shingles, and a box cornice. In each gable end is an inside end chimney constructed of brick. The facade has a central bay entrance which is shielded from the elements by a one-bay one-storey entrance porch. The window sash is 9/6 on the first floor and 6/6 on the second with paneled shutters down and louvered up. The house has a stone foundation with cellar. The entrance is on the east gable wall. The exterior surface is covered by wooden siding. The house has a central stairhall with a large room to either side with fireplaces. The fireplaces have mantels with plain pilasters and frieze with some moulding below the mantel shelf.

Attached to the rear of the house is a small two storey rear wing which is also of frame construction. It has a gable roof with a brick chimney in the north gable wall. On the eastern side of the wing is a one-storey porch. The interior consists of one room on each floor with a small winding stair from the first floor to the second.
