This is one of the earliest structures around the Cara Cove section of North East, and was undoubtedly the main house for an earlier farm operation. In the area, resort development began in the early 20th century along the Northeast River.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Old Taylor Farmhouse c. 1800-1850 is located on Cara Cove Road just north of Cara Cove. The 2½ story 3 bay by one room stone farmhouse faces south with an east/west axis.

The main block is constructed of uncoursed stone and measures 28' by 17'. The structure rests on an uncoursed stone basement and is capped by a medium sloped composition tile roof. Extensive alterations occurred in the early 20th century with the remodeling of the first floor interior and the addition of a two story L addition to the rear. It is frame and 2 bays across by one room deep. A shed roof front porch was added to the main facade.

The south facade has a central entrance with a symmetrical fenestration. The window sash and trim have been replaced with modern sash. The cornice is slightly boxed.

The east and west gable ends are fairly plain with 2 four pane attic lights that flank the chimney pile. A plain bargeboard closes the gable end, and make a short return at the base. The stone piles consist of stretcher bond brick above the roof line and have a two course cap. A datestone was alluded to by the owner but none was found at time of inspection.

The first floor interior has been totally remodeled which included the removing of walls and all interior detail. This may have been a result from an extensive fire which was not mentioned.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Taylor Farmhouse remains a basic stone shell with its characteristic early 19th century form. Since it has lost most of its detail it does not remain very significant outside of its existence as an old farm site. Evidently it is one of the oldest structures in the area and was undoubtedly in the past associated with the farm land around Cara Cove. The waterfront area has been developed in the past 50 years and the farming aspect of this area has declined.




