This 2-story stuccoed brick church was rebuilt in 1870 and has had numerous alterations since then including a 20th century steeple, windows, roof, eaves, outside chimney, vents and portico. Entrance is on the front, gable end at the lower level. While the presence of a church in this area served as an anchor to the community from its earliest days, neither the building nor the events would warrant eligibility to the National Register under any of the four criteria.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Hart's Church c. 1850 is located on Turkey Point Road and just south of the intersection with Stradley Road. The gable end ~~and~~ main facade faces east with a corresponding east/west axis. The two story stuccoed structure rests on an uncoursed stone foundation and is covered with a medium sloped wood shingle roof. The structure is located on a slope so entry is gained through the lower level. The main facade has two 12/12 sash windows ^{that} flank the entrance. The main sanctuary windows are an extremely long 9/9 sash with plain trim. The eaves are extended on the gable end and have returns ~~at~~ the base of the roof.

The north and south sides are similar with 3 sanctuary windows and two 12/12 sash on the ground floor. ~~Third was not possible due to the slope of the ground.~~

A rear entrance to the sanctuary and a modern block stove stack are found on the west end.

The interior, although not open at time of visit consists of three rooms; an entrance hall with stairs leading to the sanctuary, the sanctuary itself, and a congregational hall with kitchen facilities on the first floor.




