DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Clay Martin c. 1865 is a two story side hall/parlor frame house on Oldfield Point Road just south of Elkton and near Jones Chapel. The main facade has a western exposure with the main gable running north/south.

The front block is 3 bays across by one room deep. A l. kitchen addition extends to the east and a single story shed section is attached to it. Within the recent past a single story gabled section was added to the south gable. Along with this addition aluminum siding was applied to the entire house. The house rests on a fieldstone foundation and is capped with a medium sloped tin roof.

The western facade has three openings on the first floor with an entrance located in the northern bay. Two 6/6 sash windows with plain trim and paneled shutters define the other openings. The two panel front door has remained and with 2 light transom overhead. The second floor has two 6/6 sash with louvered shutters. The eave is decorated with a pierced fascia and corner pendant drops. A single story shed roof porch extends across the main facade with square chamfered supporting posts.

The north gable end has a single 6/6 sash on each floor. The eave has an identical fascia with the north side of the 2 story rear section has a single 6/6 sash on each floor.

The rest of the house is similarly detailed and the south side is primarily covered with the recent addition. The interior has typical mid to late 19th century woodwork.

A couple of frame sheds with board siding are located to the east of the main house.




