Slight liberties were taken with the traditional center hall single pile form when the Milliken House was erected. A taller main block provides a full third floor and extra 3/3 sash illuminate that space. Otherwise, the structure is severely plain. This house appears to have been assessed along with 60 acres in 1877 for George Crow.

The Milliken house circa 1875 is a 2½ story frame I house located on Oldfield Point Road north of Plum Creek. The house faces South with the main gable running East/West.

The T plan I house is a common three bays across by one room deep with a central passage to the rear T section. It has a two story two bay by one room kitchen wing. The structure rests on a fieldstone foundation and is sheathed with novelty siding. The medium sloped tile roof has a central cross gable.

The south (main) facade is typically symmetrical with six-over-one sash windows centered around the main entrance. The door is a replacement but the three light sidelights and three light transom remain. A small pediment with diagonal supports protects the entry. The attic is illuminated by small three-over-three lights under the projecting eave and a six-over-six light in the cross gable. A small pendant drop is located in the peak of the gable. The front eaves are closed.

The gable ends are similar with six-over-one sash illuminating each floor and two six-over-six sash at attic level. The east end retains its interior end brick stack but the west end stack has been replaced with an exterior one of 20th Century construction.

The rear kitchen wing is basically similar. An interior brick stove stack with two course corbelled cap rises out of the end wall. A later single story shed porch is found on the last side.

A large gambrel roof barn with horizontal weather boarding and a fieldstone foundation is found to the south of the main house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Milliken house is a generally significant house type for the Mid-Atlantic region. The I house form is common throughout and the Milliken house offers a slight variation with the third story three-over-three sash windows. The barn is also a nice example of its type and not commonly found on the Elk Neck. The house appears to have been assessed along with 60 acres in 1877 under the ownership of George Crow.
