DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Latvalla House probably dates from the first half of the 19th century. Little dateable material remains on the exterior and permission was not granted for an interior investigation. The house is located on Old Elk Neck Road just south of Jones Chapel. The house faces east with the primary gable running north/south.

The 2 story 1 room (18⁶ x 19³) structure is constructed of logs. The owner cut a window through the north wall and revealed the logs. Corner notching could not be seen. It rests on an uncoursed stone foundation and is sheathed with asbestos siding. The medium sloped~~g~~ roof is covered with tin. Single story shed additions are attached to the west (back) side of the house. A shed roof porch covers the first floor of the east side.

The east (main) facade has three openings on the first floor with a central entrance flanking 6/6 sash with plain trim. There are two 6/6 sash on the second floor and a boxed cornice at eave level.

The south facade is covered on the first floor by a shed addition. A plain bargeboard closes the gable end. A large stuccoed stack with corbelled cap protrudes out of the gable end. A six pane attic light is found to the west of the stack.

The west side of the log structure is primarily covered with a single story shed addition there are two window openings on the second floor one with its 6/6 sash. The north end of the house has a recently cut-in sash on the first floor and a small attic light.

The interior was not open but the owner said it *has* been remodeled.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Latvalla House still retains exterior architectural significance with its basic form and appearance still intact. Logical frame shed additions have been attached and do not detract from the character of the two story log building. The house is one of a half dozen located in the Jones Chapel vicinity in 1877 and this appears to have been owned by R. Jones.
