DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

PINE GROVE STONE HOUSE

The Pine Grove Stone house circa 1830 is a two story fieldstone structure on Oldfield Point Road just north of Plum Creek. The house faces East and the Elk River with the main gable running North/South.

The early fieldstone structure is three bays across by one room deep with a two story 20th Century rusticated block addition to the north. It continues the same roofline of the earlier structure and is one bay across by one room deep. A hip roof front porch of similar early 20th Century date stretches across the west facade of the entire four bays.

The earlier section has an exposed fieldstone basement on the east side. The first floor of the east side seems to have been covered with an addition and then removed to expose the fieldstone construction. Above the first floor the exterior has been stuccoed. An earlier door opening has been blocked up to a four pane light. An entrance with board door and mortised frame is located in the southern bay. A few six-over-six sash windows also remain. The block addition has six-over six sash and extended concrete lintels. The roof seems to have been replaced with the new addition and is of medium slope with a tile sheathing.

The south end of the fieldstone section has a large interior end stone pile and a single six-over-six sash and one two-over-two attic light. The eaves are slightly extended.

The north gable end consists of two six-over-six sash each floor and a six-over-six attic light. The gable end above the second floor is covered by rounded fishscale shingles.

The west facade of the fieldstone structure has a northern bay entrance and a six-over-six sash to the south. There are two six-over-six sash on the second floor. This side of the fieldstone has been totally stuccoed.

Entrance was not gained in this instance and some early woodwork may remain. The fieldstone portion of the house is in poor condition and probably due to the removing of supportive earth on the east side.
