C. 1860-1890

Mount Zoar is a black settlement that began in the 3rd quarter of the 19th Century along Mt. Zoar Road and just west of Route 222. Approximately one dozen structures stand both along the road and back from it in no discernable relation to one another. Located among the standard two story 2 bay by 1 room frame houses is a frame Methodist church (CE-877) and a 19th Century frame schoolhouse with projecting entrance and bell tower. (CE-876). The schoolhouse is one of the more unusual of its type in the entire county.

 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Mount Zoar Community is a Black settlement probably begun in the late 19th Century. The small settlement of around a dozen structures contribute to a village atmosphere along Mt. Zoar Road, west of Route 222.

A sample house was taken as the common form. Various additions were added ~~to~~ to the structures to make them different but they all have a basic 2 story frame block, 2 bays across by ~~2 bays~~ deep. The structures rest on uncoursed fieldstone foundations and are capped with a medium pitched roof. The entire structure is covered with some type of asphalt shingle. The sash are usually 6/6 with plain ~~wood~~ surrounds. A small brick stack usually protrudes out of one gable end. The house is approximately square.

The interior was not open for inspection, but the majority were one room plans with a few hall/parlor plans.


