DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Jones House is a late 19th century 2¹/₂ frame structure located on Johnson Road ^{570.19} 1/2 mile east of Route 222. The house is on the south side of the road with the main facade facing north, and the primary gable running east/west. The house is not located on the 1877 map but was probably built before the turn of the century.

The main block is 4 bays across by one room deep with a single story shed addition on the south side and a single story shed porch with turned posts and scrolled brackets. The baluster is a later addition.

The structure rests on an uncoursed stone foundation and is totally covered with weather board siding. The slate roof is of a steep pitch.

The north (main) facade is a 4 bays across. Entrances are located in the ~~center~~ bays. The trim is slightly beaded and late 19th century 4 panel doors are in plain. The window sash is 2/2 on the first floor and 6/6 on the second.

The west gable end is devoid of much detail other than a single 2/2 sash on the first floor and a basement window. A small stretcher bond brick stack rises out of the gable end. The eaves are extended with the soffits closed. A second stack is found in the center on the main block.

The south side (rear) is covered with a single story shed addition. The sash windows on the second floor are 6/6.

The east end is similar in detail at the west gable end.

The interior was not seen. But not particularly worthy of note.

A medium sized board and batten barn is located to the east of the main house. A small addition is attached to the south gable end. A earthen ramp lends access to the second floor and the first floor on the opposite side is exposed.
