

The Chandlee-Pierce house is not an unusual house type for the third quarter of the 19th century. In fact many times this type of house was used as tenant houses for larger farms. ~~The~~ ~~part~~ ~~houses~~. This structure, however seems to have remained as a separate farm. E. G. Chandlee owned this two story hall plan house with kitchen wing in 1877 and was assessed in 1860 for a house and stable for \$400.00. Later 20th century additions disguise the earlier size of the main house.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

CHANDLEE - PIERCE HOUSE

The Chandlee - Pierce house circa 1860 is a two story two bay by one room frame house on Earleville Road and south of Hack's Point, Maryland. The house faces west with the main block having a north/south axis.

The two story main block has a one and one-half two bay by one room half gable kitchen wing that extends to the east and perpendicular to the main block. The two story two bay by one room frame addition to the south and perpendicular to the main block was added within the memory of the present owner.

The house rests on a fieldstone foundation and is covered with asbestos over weatherboard. The steeply pitched roof is covered with composition tile.

The west (main) facade of the structure has a central entrance with flanking six-over-six sash windows. The trim is plain. There are two six-over-six sash on the second floor with a simple boxed cornice above. The four panel front door still remains.

The north end has a four pane light on the east side of the brick stove stack. A plain bargeboard protects the end rafter. A exterior basement entrance is located in this side also.

The east side of the main block is covered with the kitchen wing which is in turn partially covered with shed additions on the first floor. Detailing remains very plain with three-over-six sash on the second floor and a tall brick stove stack in the east end. The north shed is an extension of the kitchen and abutts the glassed-in shed on the east end. An entrance with four panel door is located on this opening.

The early 20th Century two story addition has two-over-two sash windows, plain trim, extended eaves, and sloped soffit. The west side has two sash on each floor and a attic gable light. A shed roof porch of early 29th Century date stretches across the central three openings.

The interior of the main block has been partially remodeled but a typical mid to late 19th Century mantel remains with simple chamfered supports, plain frieze, and thick shelf. The main block has one room on the first floor with a replaced stair on the east wall.

The kitchen has also been moderately changed to accommodate moderate cooking facilities.

Mid 19th Century barn buildings that remain include a single story double pen corn crib with central passage, medium sized three bay by two bay frame barn, and four bay wagon shed.

CHANDLEE - PIERCE HOUSE SIGNIFICANCE

The Chandlee - Pierce house is a very common house type for the third quarter of the 19th Century. This structure, however, appears to be more substantial than just a tenant house to a large farm where the ^{19th Century} one room plan was usually employed. ~~The tenant houses are usually not given an owner on the 1877 Lake Griffing, and Stevenson Atlas.~~ E. G. Chandlee was owning the house at the time of the map. E. G. Chandlee was assessed in 1860 for a house and stable at \$400.00.

The house was enlarged in a consistant manner to the original block and therefore the house appears as a single and unified dwelling. The detailing is typical architecturally and offers no unusal differences.


