DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Etherington-Davis House c. 1860-1870 is a 2½ story frame house on Lovers Lane just east of Cecilton, Md. The house faces west with a north/south main gable orientation.

The main three ^{DAY} bay by one room block ^{HAS A REAR 2 STORY KITCHEN} wing with a single story shed additions on each side. The house rests on a fieldstone foundation ^{AND HAS} a sheathing of aluminum over weatherboard. The steeply pitched composition tile roof ^{WITH} a central cross gable. The eaves are extended around the house with sloped soffits.

The main facade has a central entrance with a modern door and later cut-in sidelights. The 2/2 sash windows have plain surrounds with no shutters. Three 2/2 sash light the second floor and a 2/2 sash illuminates the attic. A central brick stack rises out of the main block and used to be one of a pair that were on either side of the hall. The north stack has been removed. A three bay front porch which has by now been enclosed had a central gable and turned support posts. Scrolled brackets and a spindled railing decorated the eave area.

The south end has a 2/2 sash on each floor and one that lights the attic.

The rear wing has a central brick stack. The sash and other detailing is similar to that of the main block.

Interior woodwork conforms to typical late 19th century detailing. A heavily turned newel has a reeoped cannonball finial. The door and window surrounds are fluted with bullseye corner blocks. The north parlor interior wall has been removed which includes the hall and north parlor. ~~All woodwork is typical of late 19th century.~~

A typical granary is found east of the house, with remnants of earlier farm structures such as a windmill etc.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

At the time of inspection the late 19th century decorative porch added a great deal to the over all appearance of this c. 1860 house. The house has otherwise been remodeled and lost its 19th century character. The front porch still remains but has been closed in with aluminum siding.

The house's exterior has lost a great deal of its late 19th century architectural appeal. The structure appears on the Lake, Griffing, and Stevenson Atlas under the name of William Etherington.
