

The Barclay house was undoubtedly sited along the Cecilton-Warwick Road because of the activity between the two towns in the mid to late 19th century. The side hall/parlor plan is not an unusual house type and often used for modest dwellings. The Barclay house was one of four structures in a row at this point however this was the only one moved back when the road was widened.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The - Barclay House c. 1870 is a two story three bay side hall/parlor plan frame house on the Cecilton-Warwick Road just west of Warwick. The house faces south with the main gable running east/west.

The main block has a two bay by one room ell addition to the north. The entire house rests on a block foundation since the structure was moved back from 282 when the road was widened. The weatherboard siding is exposed on all sides except the west end which has been covered with a modern plywood. The medium sloped roof has a composition tile sheathing. The eaves are extended and the rafters exposed. 2/2 sash with plain surrounds light the first floor. An entrance provides access in the western most bay and retains its four panel late 19th century door. Three 6/6 sash light the second floor.

The west end has a single 2/2 sash on the first floor. The east end is basically similar with the addition of a exterior brick stove stack which probably replaced the interior stack when the house was moved. A single 2/2 sash lights each floor and a attic light.

The east side of the wing is soon to be covered by a two story addition which will continue the slope of the ell. Primary details remain the same with the ell. A single story shed addition extends across the north end and another brick stack rises from it.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The interior of this house was not seen but not particularly important due to its late date and partial remodelization. The house was probably one of four like it that faced the Cecilton-Warwick Road. It was undoubtedly decided to move this one and tear the others down. *WHEN THE ROAD WAS WIDENED.*

The house is a plain example of the numerous side hall/parlor frame houses that date from the third or fourth quarters of the 19th century.




