Symmetrical five or three bay three story main elevations
are found throughout the southern and northern landscapes of
Cecil County. The Young-Jester House stands south of Earleville
and towers over the surrounding corn fields. The three story form with
small third floor sash windows was introduced into American
Architecture in the late 18th Century Federal period. The
use of such a window, however, continued through the Greek Revival
period c. 1820-1840, and which is the category this house falls.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

YOUNG - JESTER PROPERTY

The Young-Jester house circa 1850 is a three story five bay single pile central hall frame structure off Route 282 and South of Earleville, Maryland. The house faces North with the main gable running East/West.

The main block rests on a full fieldstone basement and is totally sheathed with asbestos siding over weatherboard. The low sloping gable roof has a tin sheathing. Extending to the south is a two story two bay by one room frame kitchen wing.

The main facade has the typical symmetrical fenestation with central entrance. The six panel door with ogee molded insets is framed by a plain surround with three light transom. The six-over-six sash has a plain surround with a slightly extended lintel cap. Three panel shutters flank the first floor sash and louvered shutters are found on the second floor. The third floor three-over-three lights have louvered shutters also. The blinds are held back by stary shaped shutter docs - a simple boxed cornice stretches above the third floor sash. Covering the three central bays is a shed roof porch with square posts.

The east and west gable end are identical with two six-over-six sash on each floor and two three-over-three attic lights. A brick stove stack rises between the windows and a plain bargeboard closes the gable.

The south side of the house is partially covered with the kitchen wing which covers the two eastern bays. The detailing remains the same but there is the expected aysmetrical placement of doors and windows. The central second and third floor windows are slightly lower than the rest.

The kitchen wing has a tall central stack and a shed porch that extends around the west side and part of the south end. Tall window and door details remain the same. A small shed hood is found over the eastern entrance. The south end is plain.

Not too many barn buildings remain with the house. A small frame dairy is found directly south of the main house.

The Young-Jester property is a typical mid-19th Century house type, (see Bloomingdale - CE -17) The interior was not entered but it was evident that some of the woodwork has been removed. The house does appear on the 1877 Lake, Griffing, and Stevenson Atlas under the name of Misses Young.


