DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Knight-Pippin House c. 1870 is a two story four bay by one room frame house on Md. 282 just south of Earleville, Md.

The house rests on an uncoursed fieldstone foundation and is sheathed of asbestos over weatherboard siding. There is a medium pitch to the tin roof. A single story shed addition extends to the east and a modern block addition is attached to the south side.

The house may have been built in two sections but due to the asbestos siding and no visible seams this is only a guess. An entrance is located in the second bay from the east with a multi-pane glass door and plain surround. Two 2/2 window sash flank the entry. Two more 2/2 sash occupy the third and fourth bays. The 4 bays on the second floor have a 6/6 sash. The boxed cornice is plain. A shed roof porch stretches across the three eastern bays and is supported by turned posts with scrolled brackets. The ends are decorated with a mouse-troth vertical board. Brick stove stacks rise out of each gable end and are flanked by four pane attic windows. The eaves are closed with a plain bargeboard.

The back of the house is covered on the first floor with the block addition. The second floor has similar details as the rest of the house.

The interior consists of two rooms on the first floor main block with fairly plain details.

A frame barn with vertical board siding and fieldstone foundation is located across the road.


