DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Davis Tenant House c. 1875 is a 2 story 4 bays by 1 room frame house north of Wards Hill Road and just east of the Cecilton-Warwick Road. The house faces south with the main gable running east/west.

The structure rests on a brick foundation above ground level and is totally sheathed with composition tile shingles. The comp. tile roof has a medium pitch. It seems as if a 2 story 2 bay by 1 room frame addition was attached to the east end and set perpendicularly to the main roof axis. Later single story gabled and shed additions extend from it. The additions are covered in the same manner as the main block.

What seems to be the main facade (south) is 4 bay across with a shed porch extending across three. Bays, two central doors and an eastern 6/6 sash. The shed roof is supported by late 19th century turned posts with decorative corner brackets. The 4 panel door have typical interior locks. A boxed cornice stretches across at eave level.

The west gable end is basically plain with 2 four pane attic sash that flank the interior end brick stove stack. The end eaves extend with short returns.

The north side is basically the same as the main facade with the exception of only one door in the eastern central bay and no shed porch. All the 6/6 sash remain with plain trim.

The east end is totally covered with the addition but a stove stack does protrude out of the east gable end of the main block.

The east end addition is primarily the same as the main block with 6/6 sash and extended eaves.

The interior of the main block was not entered directly but two rooms are visible of the first floor with a winder stair and closet in the northeastern corner and enclosed with beaded boards. A plain mantel shelf is found over the fireplace opening. The western room mantel however, has elaborate applied ornament on side pilasters, and the central frieze. There is a thick and slightly molded mantel shelf.
