The Ernest House is an interesting early 20th century construction of the I-House form with a modified floor plan. Except for the block foundation detailing remains the same as most late 19th century examples.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ernest House c. 1920 is an I-House form with a side hall/parlor plan. The two story frame is located down a lane to the south of Ward's Hill Road. The house faces north with a E/W gable axis. An older house, owned in 1877 by A. Johns, was at the end of the lane and replaced by this one in the early 20th century.

The Three bay by one room frame main block has a T kitchen wing to the south. A shed roof porch is located in the east side of the kitchen and is partially enclosed. A shed porch with central pediment stretches across the main facade with chamfered corner posts and decorated gable ends. The house rests on a partial concrete block foundation and is sheathed with weatherboard siding. The composition tile roof has a medium pitch with exposed rafter ends.

The north facade has a western bay entrance with multi-pane door and plain trim. The 2/2 sash are with out shutters. A Small four pane light illuminates the cross gable. The west gable end is basically plain with a second floor 2/2 sash and four pane attic lights. The east end has a sash on each floor and two that flank the interior end brick stove stack.

The rear kitchen wing is similarly detailed with a central brick stove stack.

Ordinarily early 20th century barn buildings are found south and west of the house.
