C. 1853-1860

This elaborate Greek Revival/Italianate house was built between 1853 and 1860 by William Price. (Cecil County Tax Assessments, 1853-1860) An engraving of the farm is illustrated in the Lake, Griffing, and Stevenson Atlas of 1877. Architecturally, William Price was conscious of current building trends. Numerous structures of similar design are found throughout the County but most do not approach the amount of detail that remains with this residence.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCEPRICE - WORKMAN HOUSE

The Price - Workman House circa 1860 is a three story "L" plan Italianate frame located on Telegraph Road just North of Warwick, Maryland. The main facade faces east with primary gable running North/South. *GREEK REVIVAL*

The main block is five bays across by one room deep with kitchen wing of the same height and two bays across by one room deep to the west. The large weather-boarded structure rests on an uncoursed fieldstone foundation and is capped with a shallow hip roof. The typical heavily dentiled cornice stretches around the entire "L" shape.

The east (main) facade is five bays across with a central entrance and symmetrical fenestration. Six-over-six sash are found on the first and second floor with shallow pedimented lintels and plain trim. Two panel shutters with cast iron latches and shell motif shutter dogs are found on the first floor. Louvered shutters are found on the second floor and also flank the three-over-three third floor lights. Simple corner pilasters decorate the main corners on the house including the back. The central entrance has a large four panel door with heavy ogee molded insets. The door is flanked by sidelights and a panel below and a four light transom. The lights are framed by a simple set of pilasters that support a plain frieze and dentiled cornice stretches across the central three bays. *A FLAT ROOFED PORCH w/ SQUARE PIE*

The south gable end is a completely plain weatherboard wall with an interior end brick stack. *Ami*

The north end of the main block has an identical end chimney along with a sash on each floor.

The rear two bay by one room section continues the same detailing as the main block. Windows are flanked by shutters with a shell motif shutter dogs. A single story shed addition extends off the west end of the kitchen and is joined on the south side with the single story porch. The single story porch is the same as the main facade detailing. Other detailing on the back of the house remains consistent with the main facade.

The interior could not be viewed throughout, but the first floor has a typical central hall with stair. A heavily turned newel supports a continuous flat oval handrail. The four panel doors are surrounded by widely molded architraves.

The north parlor has a simple mid 19th Century mantel with simple pilasters that support a plain frieze and shelf. The room was undoubtedly used for dining and has a large four door cupboard to the east of the fireplace.

Significant outbuildings include a large fieldstone meat house, a pyramidal roof privy and a 20th Century dairy. The meat house is quite large and has been stuccoed. A tin roof presently covers the structure. The entrance is in the eastern gable end. A small two seat privy with weatherboard siding and a pyramidal roof sits southwest of the main house. Another privy is found farther west of the house. The 20th Century dairy has a concrete foundation and narrow vertical strip siding. A wind mill is also located out back.

GREEK REVIVAL

William Price owned this stylish Italianate house in 1897 and may be the one responsible for building it. An ink drawing of the house and grounds also appear in the Atlas. ^{WILLIAMS, CRIPPING AND STEVENSON} The house although presently in rather poor condition still retains a great deal of its architectural significance due to the survival of most of the exterior and interior detail.


