This large private family cemetery stands near the site of a 19th century Hawkins home called Oakley which was destroyed by fire in 1968. The Hawkins family has maintained land holdings here since the late 17th century.

The Hawkins Family Cemetery is the ancestral burying place for the Hawkins family of Charles County which have held property in the Hawkins Gate vicinity since the 17th century. The site consists of a small family burial plot containing thirteen marked gravestones surrounded by a Gothic-style iron fence with a gate on the south wall. Gravestones range in date from the mid- 18th to the early 20th century. Several Hawkin's family homes survive in the vicinity including Western View (CH-156) and Englewood (CH-303).

The Hawkins Family Cemetery is located on the west side of Hawkins Gate Road to the east of LaPlata. The site consists of a small family burial plot containing thirteen marked gravestones surrounded by a gothic style iron fence with a gate on the south wall. Standing in the center of the plot is a mature pine tree.

The date on the stones range from the mid-eighteenth to early twentieth century, with the oldest being that of Henry Holland Hawkins who died in 1750. The most recent grave belonged to James Ellen Marshall who died in November of 1932.

The cemetery is situated near the road in a contemporary housing development. A new dwelling is located directly to the south. Currently the burial site is not being maintained and is covered by heavy overgrowth.

The Hawkins Family Cemetery is the ancestral burying place for the Hawkins family of Charles County which have held property in the Hawkins Gate vicinity since the 17th century. Consequently the stones in the cemetery range in date from the mid-eighteenth to the early twentieth century. The earliest gravestone on the site is one of Henry Holland Hawkins who died in 1750.

The most recent marker belonged to a James Ellen Hawkins who passed away in November of 1932. In his last will and testament "Jemmie" E. Hawkins requested his farm known as "Oakley" to be sold. The following year, Hawkins family heirs sold the entire property except the "500 square feet that the family reserves as a family burial lot" to the Federal Land Bank of Baltimore. The lot was described as 50 x 50 feet, enclosed in an iron fence and standing about one hundred yards northwest of the dwelling.

While Oakley burned in 1968, several other Hawkin's family homes survive in the vicinity including Western View (CH-156) and Englewood (CH-303).








