Of frame construction, this small two-story structure was three bays in length and contained two ground-floor rooms. At one end stood an exterior chimney flanked by one-story brick pents. A later shed-roofed extension was made to the rear wall. The structure was built on foundation walls of dressed stone (believed to be from Virginia's Aquia Creek quarries), enclosing a full cellar.
