
Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: (Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)

The Jameson-Tolson House is located at the end of a long dirt drive along the east side of Oliver's Shop Road (about .4 of a mile south of the intersection of Oliver's Shop Road and Oak Road.) The single, two story frame dwelling is vacant and in very poor condition. The building seems to date to the last decade of the nineteenth century. Some evidence suggests the building was moved from another location early in the 20th century and served as a tenant farm dwelling. (Specific evidence includes the foundation configurations as well as the general orientation of the building in the landscape.) The remains of a more decorative porch with turned column/posts, centered on a four (4) bay façade, are located at the far side from the site's access drive. (The "L" addition seems to have been constructed near the same time as the principle block and/or when the building was relocated to this site). The general neglected and deteriorated condition of the building, along with the possibility that it has been moved from its original site, is the basis for a recommendation that the site is not eligible for listing to the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C. No documentation has been found to support a recommendation under the other Criteria. The site was not evaluated for Criterion D.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story frame house stands at the end of a long drive, leading through the woods up to the back of the house, suggesting that in earlier days the house stood elsewhere. Along the original front of the house extends a shed porch supported by turned posts. The house is four bays in length, and one in depth, with a one bay L attachment extending from the ZN.E. corner. The house is painted white, and has a tin roof. A brick stove ascends through the middle of the principal block, and another through the L.

The downstairs consists of a living room and kitchen in the principal block, and a bedroom in the L. Upstairs there are two bedrooms and a large wstairwell. The rooms were heated in the downstairs by wood stoves, while the upstairs chambers were unheated. Cooking was done over a gas range. There was no running water during the time of this investigation in the winter, the pipes having frozen. Water was hauled in buckets from a spring nearby.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The informants who were interviewed in the community did not know the history of this house, except that it had always been occupied by tenant farmers as far back as they knew (early 1900's). It is considerably larger than most tenant houses built at that time, so it was probably built as a landowner's house, and moved to this site as a tenant house.

The two sons of the Tolson family, Joseph and Roy, were especially helpful in this survey, leading me to several reported "old houses" in the vicinity, and assisting in recording them, and in so doing learning about their local history and improving their skills in reading and writing, all of which goes to show the great educational potential of the survey work.
