The Pomonkey Elks Lodge, built circa 1935, consists of a simple rectangular block covered by an asphalt-shingled front gable roof that is concealed behind a shaped front parapet. The frame building is two-bays wide and two deep. A metal clad flue pierces the west roof face and replacement 6/6 and 2/2 windows fill the original window bays. The single-bay portico that protects the main entrance has the same roof pattern as that of the main roof.

The Pomonkey Elks Lodge was erected circa 1935 for local lodge #968 of the Benevolent & Protective Order of Elks of the World. The building, which retains its original form, is a good example of a early 20th century social hall, one of a very few remaining in Charles County.

The Pomonkey Elks Lodge, built circa 1935, consists of a simple rectangular block covered by an asphalt-shingled front gable roof that is concealed behind a shaped front parapet. The frame building is two-bays wide and two deep. A metal clad flue pierces the west roof face and replacement 6/6 and 2/2 windows fill the original window bays. A single-bay portico protects the main entrance. Its roof pattern imitates that of the main roof, and segmental openings define its three sides.

A 1-story shed addition was added to the east side of the building. This frame section also features a front parapet wall that screens the roof's slope.

There are no associated outbuildings on the site. The meeting hall is located within a large gravel parking area adjacent to a local bar and general store.

The Pomonkey Elks Lodge was erected circa 1935 for local lodge #968 of the Benevolent & Protective Order of Elks of the World. The building, which retains its original form, is a good example of a early 20th century social hall, one of a very few remaining in Charles County.

The Order of Elks is a nationwide service organization made up of volunteers who provide support to their members, as well as undertaking charitable and service oriented projects for the general public. Founded in 1868 in New York by a group of actors, the order is now one of the oldest and largest private organizations in the United States, encompassing some 2,200 local "Lodges" with nearly 1.3 million members.

The Pomonkey Elks Lodge was erected circa 1935 on a 4-acre lot purchased for \$350 from William F. Cole of Charles County.


# RESOURCE SKETCH MAP




Elks Lodge, Pomonkey
