Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: (Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)

Simpkin Coatback is located down a long gravel drive on the south side of Charles Street (Rte. 6) near Dentsville, Maryland. The house stands on a ridge amid open fields and pasture in view of the intersection of Trinity Church Road and Charles Street. The 1 1/2 story side gable, double pile frame dwelling, thought to be constructed in the third quarter of the eighteenth century is a "room-behind-room plan" (inverted hall and parlor.) Additions were constructed at various times in the building's history. The original exterior walls have been modified and removed in part to provide porch spaces. Fenestration patterns have changed. Chimneys have either been replaced or rebuilt along the north façade. Originally weatherboard siding has been covered with asphalt sheets and the roof has been replaced with asphalt materials. The site also includes a Shed and Tobacco Barn both in fair to poor condition.

The architectural integrity has been significantly compromised with these changes and the resource is recommended as not eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C. Research did not indicate evidence for listing under Criteria A or B. The site was not evaluated for Criterion D.

Although sheathed in 20th century treatments, this house is an example of a distinct regional architectural style that developed in Southern Maryland and Eastern Virginia during the last half of the 18th century. The inverted hall and parlor, or room-behind-room plan is characterized by narrow front and rear elevations and a high and deep roof. Constructed during the first quarter of the 19th century, this 1-1/2 story side gable, double pile frame dwelling faces east and includes a likely contemporary 1-1/2 story, single pile wing extending off the south wall. A 1-3/4 cross gable addition is connected to the rear elevation by a series of low sheds. A modest sized shed stands in the rear yard, and a mid-19th century tobacco barn stands nearby. The earliest part of the dwelling is believed to have been constructed after 1818 by Nathan Dent. In April of that year he acquired Simpkin Coatback from his brother, Thomas, who had inherited this property from their father William Dent, Sr.

Although sheathed in 20th century treatments, this house is an example of a distinct regional architectural style that developed in Southern Maryland and Eastern Virginia from the third quarter of the 18th century. The inverted hall and parlor or room-behind-room plan is characterized by narrow front and rear elevations and a high and deep roof. Constructed during the first quarter of the 19th century, this 1-1/2 story side gable, double pile frame dwelling faces east and includes a likely contemporary 1-1/2 story, single pile wing extending off the south wall. A 1-3/4 cross gable addition is connected to the rear elevation by a series of low sheds. The house stands on a ridge amid open fields and pasture in view of the intersection of Trinity Church Road and Charles Street. It is set apart from several mid-20th century dwellings in the vicinity by its relative distance from, and asymmetrical alignment with, nearby roads. A modest sized shed stands in the rear yard, and a mid-19th century tobacco barn stands nearby. Non-contributing resources sharing the site include a 20th century equipment shed and a tobacco barn.

Originally clad in weatherboard siding, asphalt sheets have been applied overtop. The roof is clad in asphalt and the foundation material consists of brick piers reinforced with concrete blocks. An incised porch, which was probably an alteration of the original flush exterior wall, is supported on brick posts on the façade and includes a low brick skirt. It has since been enclosed. Two replacement or rebuilt chimneys stand on the exterior of the north wall, likely in their original positions.

The north elevation, in addition to the chimneys, includes three first floor and two second story asymmetrical windows. The rear of the main block includes a full width shed addition that extends the rear wall. An additional 1- story gabled walkway connects this with the rear addition. A single 6/6 light window is found on the rear wall of the main block near the northwest corner.

To the south of the main block is a wing believed to either be contemporary with the original structure or the earliest addition. This wing has a steeply pitched metal seam roof and contains a single 6/6 window on the east elevation eave wall. The south wall also has a 6/6 window below an attic or loft offset fixed light. A small shed addition extends from the rear of this dwelling.

The rear addition is a two bay structure. It has a asphalt shingle roof pierced by a corbel capped chimney. One room deep, the north elevation has symmetrical fenestration consisting of two first floor 6/6 windows and two 6 light fixed windows above, positioned directly under the cornice line. The west elevation is without fenestration. The south wall has the same second story configuration although one original fixed window has been replaced with a modern tilting sash window. The first floor has a shallow shed porch containing a string of dissimilar fenestration. From left to right there is a 6/6 window near the west wall, a doorway, paired 9/9 windows and a grouping of four 6/6 windows.

The interior was not available at the time of the survey.

SHED

This side gable frame structure is rectangular in form and clad in weatherboard siding. Positioned within the domestic yard, the structure was likely used as a woodshed or meathouse.

TOBACCO BARN

This is a large barn clad in vertical board siding. A shed addition extends from west elevation. Although heavily overgrown, hand-forged iron hinges were visible on the narrow gable end doors.

Likely constructed during the first quarter of the 19th century, Simpkin Coatback is one of a handful of examples of the regionally distinctive room-behind-room plan. The earliest part of the dwelling is believed to have been constructed after 1818 by Nathan Dent. In April of that year he acquired Simpkin Coatback from his brother, Thomas, who had inherited this property from their father William Dent, Sr. Thomas had been willed the property in 1816 from his father William, unless he wished "to remove to any of the new states". In 1828 Nathan Dent's property, including Simpkin Coatback, was seized by the sheriff to satisfy his debts to George Parnham to whom he owed \$435.59.

The auctioned property was purchased by Theophilus Dent. In 1862, Dent deeded the property to John James Robertson. Equity records relate that John James Robertson died in 1865 at Chaptico in St. Mary's County, and his wife died soon after. They left behind three children, one of which died by 1868. By the time of the equity hearing determining the future of the Robertson's property, Simpkins Coatback contained 195 acres, 1/3 of which was arable. The farm included an "old dwelling house and meathouse in bad condition, and a very good corn house and barn."

Finally in 1874, the property was conveyed to Richard Wheatley, remaining in the Wheatley family until 1918 when it was sold to James G. Cooksey. The Cooksey family retained ownership until it was sold to the current owners in 1982.

Other examples of this room-behind-room plan include Laurel Branch (CH-370) and two homes sharing the name Mount Pleasant (CH-208, CH298). Neither Mount Pleasant remains standing and Laurel Branch was moved to the National Colonial Farm, Prince George's County in 1988.


RESOURCE SKETCH MAP



CHARLES STREET




