The Scout Camp Road Tenant House is a well-preserved, unadorned one-story, frame side-passage dwelling located on a fifty acre farm near the St. Mary's County line. Built in three stages, the original structure faces south and is sited directly on Scout Camp Road. Erected at the end of the second World War, it has a 2-room hall and parlor plan, with front and rear porches as an integral part of the original structure. Not long after its construction, a rear shed addition was built followed by a final addition which extended the west wall. Several outbuildings contribute to the site's significance, including a privy located near the dwelling and two tobacco barns, a shed and chicken house sited behind the dwelling in an open, cultivated field. While the property has been associated with the Canter family since the 19th century, oral tradition asserts that this was the home of an African-American family having the surname Washington.

The Scout Camp Road Tenant House is a well-preserved, unadorned one-story frame, side-passage dwelling located on a fifty acre farm near the St. Mary's County line. Built in three stages, the original structure faces south and is sited directly on Scout Camp Road. It has a hall and parlor plan and was erected at the end of the second World War. Front and rear porches were an integral part of the original structure. Not long after its construction, a rear shed addition was built, followed by a final addition which extended the west wall. Several outbuildings contribute to the site's significance including a privy located not far from the dwelling and two tobacco barns, a shed and chicken house sited behind the dwelling in an open, cultivated field.

The original structure, along with the first rear addition, stands on a concrete block foundation, while the latest addition rests on a continuous block foundation. The entire structure has a metal seam roof which is pierced by a single interior brick chimney. Original wood weatherboard siding sheaths the exterior with the exception of the rear wall of the most recent addition. This addition has been reclad with 4x8 panels intended to resemble vertical plank. All nails found throughout were modern.

The original front elevation consists of four bays. Two 4/4 shuttered windows lie to the west of the off-centered entrance while a single 4/4 window lies to the east. The shed roof porch, covering the easternmost 3/4 of the dwelling appears to be aligned with the entranceway. Four square wooden posts support the porch roof. The east wall includes a single 4/4 shuttered window. The rear elevation is defined by a rear kitchen door protected by a shed porch at the northeast corner. A small, generally square portion of the porch is enclosed and accessible through a door sheltered by the porch roof. This unique space has a fixed 6-light window, as well as interior nail hooks, and functioned as a meathouse.

The first addition simply extends the rear wall beyond the meathouse and includes only a 4/4 light window. The later addition adds a single 6/6 window to the front elevation and two 6/6 windows to the new west wall.

The interior currently consists of five rooms. The original kitchen occupies the easternmost end with direct outside access through the rear porch door. The remaining portion of the original dwelling consists of a somewhat larger room entered from the front door. A passage in the rear connects these two rooms. The first addition built on the north wall created an additional room, most likely a bedroom opposite the general living room. Finally, two bedrooms were added to the west end. The interior is very simply finished with wallboard and square edged wood surrounds around doors and windows. The floors are of unfinished wood.

OUTBUILDINGS

To the west of the dwelling along the treeline is a vertical board, shed roof privy. A farm lane extends northward behind the dwelling to a small recently improved chickenhouse and a combination equipment shed and all purpose shed. Beyond these, two large tobacco barns with vertical board siding are found.

First constructed c. 1945, the Scout Camp Road Tenant House is significant as a well-preserved example of an unadorned vernacular structure which was once a common part of the Charles County landscape. Tenancy replaced the system of enslaved labor after the Civil War and continued well into the middle of the 20th century. This parcel was acquired by Richard C. Swann from Sarah E.D. Canter et al in 1884. By the 1940's it was known as "Hickory Woods" and was incorporated into Richard C. Swann's "Home Place" by the time of his death. In 1947, the fifty acres were parceled off again and sold to Frank W. Canter. According to the current owner, a Canter family descendent, the house was long occupied by an African-American family with the surname of Washington.


