The Dr. Henry W. Gross homeplace on Hip Roof Road is a particularly distinctive story-and-a-half frame dwelling dating from the third quarter of the nineteenth century. The center hall/single-pile plan main block is dominated by a generous projecting porch capped by broad gable-front roof. Especially distinctive to the porch front is the flush board sheathing within the enclosed pediment or tympanum that features a well-executed Palladian style window framed by a fluted corner block surround. The porch eave is also embellished with widely spaced decorative sawn brackets. The main block is also distinguished by its individualistic gable roofed dormers that have a pointed arch motif executed with layered woodwork incorporated in the gable end. The sides of the dormers are covered with flush diagonal boards.

Dr. Henry W. Gross (1821-1894) moved from Baltimore City to Dorchester County during the mid nineteenth century, acquiring several tracts of land in what was then Parson's Creek election district. He moved to Golden Hill with his wife Rachel Gillingham, and the couple resided in the story-and-a-half house they built around 1860. Dr. Gross, who graduated from the University of Maryland Medical School, is listed in the 1870 U.S. Census with an estate valued at \$3,000. He is grouped in the census with his wife Rachel, and two nephews, George and Thomas Gillingham. Another teenager, Mark Ennalls, resided in the household as well. Dr. Gross practiced medicine in Dorchester County through the second half of the nineteenth century until his death in 1894. He was later interred in the St. Vincents Cemetery in Baltimore City. Rachel

Gross lived four years longer than her husband, and she left the family homeplace to her nephew George Hayward Gillingham. The property remained under Gillingham family tenure until 1953.

### DESCRIPTION SUMMARY

The Dr. Henry W. Gross Homeplace is a story-and-a-half, three-bay frame dwelling located at 1130 Hip Roof Road, in the Taylor's Island Election District of Dorchester County, Maryland. Supported on a brick pier foundation, the center hall/single-pile plan dwelling, dating around 1860-70, is sheathed with plain weatherboards and the steeply pitched roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the front is a gable-front porch supported on square posts and is currently screened in. The projecting porch has a enclosed pediment pierced by a Palladian window. To each side of the gable-front porch is a narrow gable roofed dormer. Extending to the rear is a single-story kitchen wing. The interior retains portions of its original third quarter of the nineteenth century woodwork. The house faces south with the gable roof oriented on an east/west axis.

### GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Dr. Henry W. Gross Homeplace stands at 1130 Hip Roof Road in the southern end of the Taylor's Island Election District in Dorchester County, Maryland. The story-and-a-half three-bay, center hall/single-pile plan main block is underpinned with a brick pier foundation, and the exterior is sheathed with plain weatherboard siding. The steeply pitched gable roof, finished on each end with extended eaves with returns, is covered with asphalt shingles.

The south (main) elevation is a three-bay façade with a projecting, gable-front porch covering the entrance. The projecting porch is supported on square posts and wrapping the porch roof are widely spaced sawn brackets. The gable-front elevation of the porch is framed by an enclosed pediment sheathed inside by flush boards that frame a Palladian type window. The Palladian window is trimmed with a fluted corner block surround. The front entrance inside the porch is defined by a reused raised six-panel door with flanking three-pane sidelights. The door frame molding is finished with an ogee backband molding. The porch is flanked on each side by replacement six-over-six sash windows, and the window lintel are a slight header molding. Fixed on the roof slope are flanking gable roofed dormers with diagonal board sides and a unusual carved trim in the gable end of the dormer that approximates a point arch. The window is a modern replacement.

The east gable end is marked by a pair of replacement windows on the first floor that retain their plain surrounds with a slight header molding. Fixed in the gable end are small attic windows with replacement windows. An interior end brick chimney finished with a corbelled cap pierces the roofline. The edge of the roof is finished with an extended eave with returns at the base.

The north side of the house is partially covered by a rear single-story service wing that extends from the west end of the main block. The wing is extended on its west side by a shed roofed section, and another shed roofed section, serving as a bathroom, is fixed on the inside corner. The roof of the main

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block is defined by a pair of gable roofed dormers that repeat the same construction as the front dormers with the diagonal board sides and carved gable end trim.

The interior survives with third quarter of the nineteenth century woodwork including a turned baluster staircase in the center hall.



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Dr. Gross' Place stands in a grove of cedar trees on a high spot at the headwaters of Honga River. It is an attractively renovated one and one-half story frame dwelling painted yellow with white trim. It is three bays long and two deep with a brick chimney within each gable. In the center of the building was added a porch with 'A' roof the same height as the main part. Its gable is a pediment with Palladian-style window. Only along this portion are their brackets at the cornice.

The building is constructed upon brick piers. The first story windows have 6/6 sash and the dormers flanking the central addition have 4/4 sash. There are 2/2 sash windows flanking the chimney on each gable.

Behind the building is a one story wing with small screened porch.

Dr. Gross' Place is one of the attractive dwellings remaining in Golden Hill. It is a simple vernacular structure with alterations around the turn of this century attempting to colonialize the vernacular building. Because of the proportions of the structure with the Palladian-style window, there is a certain naive feeling achieved.
