DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>Home Farm is a three bay long frame, shingle covered, two story structure with a one story addition on each side, the east being original, the west built recently. A porch extends across the front of both old portions, a portion being open, the rest enclosed. There is a kitchen porch on the north side. There are chimneys on both gables and none on the kitchen. On the first story there are 9/6 sash and on the second 6/6. A former door on the north was blocked when the shingles were installed.</p> <p>Interior is divided into hall and parlor, with a partly enclosed stair in the hall adjacent the fireplace. The mantel in the hall is almost identical to the one in Buck Range, also an the Neck. Chair rail exists on the first story only and the original flooring exists only on the second story.</p> <p>The second story is divided into four rooms. The stair extends to the attic which is unfinished. The rafters are joined with mortise and tenon and peg, the tie beams with a half dove tail lap and nailed. There is white pine flooring in the attic.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Home Farm is almost identical in form to the Billy Wheeler farm across the creek and in the back ground of the photo. It is moreover, a good building and has been brought into modern living without harm to the structure. It is the second most common form of vernacular dwelling in Dorchester County and specifically in the Neck District. According to a plat of survey dated Sept. 15, 1892, this part was Kate B. Dawson's part of the lands of Robert B. Spedden, dec'd.
