DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Adjacent Old Trinity Church stands a one and one-half story frame building which was at one time used for the rectory. It consists of a five bay long section with a three bay wing, both one and one-half storys. The walls are covered with asbestos siding. On each side of the 'A' roof are two dormers, while there is only one on the lower wing. All windows have 2/2 sash which were replaced around the turn of the century. Within both gables of the main part are brick chimneys while the kitchen chimney is on the outside of the gable. On the gable end of the kitchen is another twentieth century wing and covered passage.

Inside, there is a central stairhall and two rooms, both divided by vertical beaded board partitions. The fireplace walls have cupboards and the dining room wall has an enclosed secondary stair. Most of the trim appears original.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			
<p>The rectory is a very good building and one of the more refined in the area. It probably dates from around the early 19th century. The use of a central stair hall is not usually encountered in this type house in Dorchester County. The building should receive more recognition than it is presently, but its present condition is probably the result of all attention being focused upon the church itself as well as the fact that the rector lives in Cambridge.</p> <p>One way the house could become more attractive is to install windows with the correct number of panes in each sash. It is truly one of the more impressive dwellings of this type.</p>
