The Josiah Parks house is an important example of the stepped format vernacular building tradition that surfaced across the peninsular region and adjacent counties and states during the late eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. The story-and-a-half and single-story, five-part house is particularly distinctive on the Hooper's Island landscape with its site on a knoll at the north end of the community of Hoopersville. Although siding and other exterior architectural finishes are obscured by layers of synthetic materials, period architectural details point to a construction date during the third and fourth quarters of the nineteenth century when the land was held by merchant Josiah Parks (1833-1884). He is buried with his wife Priscilla Parks (1834-1877) in a family burial plot in the "hill field" on the north side of Hooper's Island Road.

Josiah Parks surfaces in the Dorchester County land records during the third quarter of the nineteenth century when he purchased small acreages on Hooper's Island; one of the tracts containing 8 acres was known as "Anchor and Hope." When the Ninth Census of the United States was levied in 1870, Josiah Parks, aged 37, was listed as a retail grocer with real estate and personal property valued at \$2500. He and his wife Priscilla and five children occupied the stepped form house adjacent to the family-owned store, which are designated at this location on the Hooper's Island district map published in 1877.

DESCRIPTION SUMMARY

The Josiah Parks house, known during the 1970s as the Parr house, stands on the south side of the Hoopersville Road at the northern of the community of Hoopersville on Middle Hooper's Island in Dorchester County, Maryland. The five-part, story-and-a-half, stepped format frame dwelling, dating from the mid to late nineteenth century, is supported on a low masonry foundation, and the exterior is clad with vinyl siding over asbestos shingles. The various gable roofs of the five-part house are covered with asphalt shingles. The house has a northerly main exposure and the roof is aligned on an east/west axis. Across the Hoopersville Road is a small family that contains the burials of Josiah Parks (1833-1884) and his wife Priscilla Parks (1834-1877) as well as Patrick O. Lewis (1819-1895) and his wife Sarah A. Lewis (1813-1891) and John W. Lewis (d. 1891) at 31 years of age.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Josiah Parks house, built during the third quarter of the nineteenth century, stands at 1905 Hoopersville Road at the north end of the community of Hoopersville on Middle Hoopers Island in Dorchester County, Maryland. The story-and-a-half, one-room plan main block is part of a five-part, stepped format frame house supported on a minimal brick foundation, and sheathed with vinyl siding over asbestos shingles. The various gable roofs are covered with asphalt shingles. The house faces north with the gable roofs oriented on an east/west axis.

The north (main) elevation of the main block is defined by a partially glazed door flanked to the east by a single-pane sash window. The story-and-a-half half story is lighted by a small sash window. The edge of the roof is finished with an extended eave. The east gable end features a single one-over-one window on the first and second stories, and the edge of the roof has an slightly extended eave. The south wall of the main block is extended by a single-story screened-in porch. The west gable end features an exterior brick chimney stack that rises against the gable end from a chimney base incorporated within the single-story hyphen section that covers the first story. The hyphen section is marked by a single window opening. The single-story hyphen section connects a slightly taller single-story, two-bay, one-room plan section that is defined on its north side by a partially glazed door and adjacent window opening. This room plan part of the house is also served by an exterior brick chimney stack that rises from within the fourth part of the dwelling, another single-story, one-bay hyphen section. The final part of the house is a single-story, two-bay frame kitchen. The north wall of the kitchen is marked by a partially glazed door opening and adjacent single-pane sash window.

SIGNIFICANCE SUMMARY

HISTORY AND SUPPORT

Josiah Parks surfaces in the Dorchester County land records during the third quarter of the nineteenth century when he purchased small acreages on Hooper's Island; one of the tracts containing 8 acres was known as "Anchor and Hope."¹ When the Ninth Census of the United States was conducted in 1870, Josiah Parks, aged 37, was listed as a retail grocer with real estate and personal property valued at \$2500.² He and his wife Priscilla and five children occupied the stepped form frame house adjacent to the family-owned store, which are designated at this site on the Hooper's Island district map of the Lake, Griffing, and Stevenson atlas.³ Josiah Parks and his wife Priscilla, who died in 1877, are interred in a family cemetery located across the county road from the house.





D-316, Josiah Parks House, northeast elevation, Hoopersville, Paul Baker Touart, 9.2013

| <p>One of the more interesting early dwellings on Hooper's Island standing in a state that looks relatively un-altered is located on the north end of the settlement. It is a five part frame dwelling, composed of three two bay units connected by two one bay units. The largest is two storys with very small window on the second story. It has a chimney on its west gable. The connecting portion is lower than both sections which it joins, although the cornice line is about the same level. Similarly, the last two sections which appear fairly late are constructed in the same manner, but are smaller in scale. The walls are covered with asbestos siding and the roof with asphalt. The building appears to date from the early 19th century.</p> | |
