| <p>Kral House is one of the handsome classically influenced mid-19th century farmhouses existing in the county. It is a frame structure built upon a brick foundation. Its east facade is three bays long with side entrance on the south end. The walls are covered with asbestos siding. At the windows are aluminum louvered shutters and original 4/4 sash. A hipped roof porch extends across its facade, a portion of which has been enclosed for a bath. The building is two bays deep. The south facade has a secondary entrance, but its gable is a full pediment like the neighboring Wilson farmhouse. At the corners of the cornice are the remaining capitals of former pilasters. The north side of the house possesses two tall brick chimneys constructed on the exterior wall. On the west side of the house is a two story addition and a carport.</p> |   |




