DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>At the western end of the Washington Cemetery Road on Rt. 16 stands a late 19th century frame classical farmhouse. It is four bays long and one bay deep. Across its facade is a leanto porch. The whole composition is built upon a rough-cast concrete block foundation. There are pilasters at the corners of the building and bracketed cornice around the base of the hip roof. At each end is a brick chimney. To the rear is a one story wing.</p> <p>Because of the assymetrical facade, the building appears to be a product of two periods of building. This theory is farther supported by an uneven line on the facade and up the roof. It is reminescent of the second and third quarters of the 19th century, but some of the trim, and especially the porch appears to date from the twentieth century.</p>
