 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a two and one half story frame house to which a more recent one story brick addition has been added, on the east side of the front, for use as a doctor's office. The three bay house has a gable roof and center gable with a pointed arch. Across the front is a one story porch supported by Doric columns with a plain ballustrade. This frame portion of the house has been altered by the addition of asphalt siding. The brick addition has a flat roof and consists of two bays, with a sash type window and a neo-colonial door with flanking pilasters and a broken pediment above.


