**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This is a T shaped two story frame house covered with brown shingle. On the front facade are two bays, plus an intersecting gabled wing on the southwest. On the front of this wing is a two story bay window under a gable with imbricated shingle. The corners of this gable are supported by bracket forms. A one story porch supported by Doric columns, with a plain ballustrade, extends across the front and east facades. In front of the door is a pedimented gable. The gable on the east side of the house is ornamented by a bargeboard. The three bay west facade has an oriel window in the center of the second story. The upper half of the windows is ornamented with a border of small panes. This is repeated in the double windows below.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Typical late 19th century features of this house are the bargeboard on the east gable, bracket forms, the oriel window on the west facade, ornamental imbricated shingle and the use of brown shingle. It appears to be a simplified shingle style house.




