This is a two and one half story frame house with a gable roof and two center chimneys. On the front are four bays. The end bay on the east side of the front is recessed. The second bay from the west is a projecting bay with a gable above. Across the front is a one story porch enclosed below the handrail and supported by rectangular columns. In front of the door is a long, low, gabled pediment.


