 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a small two and one half story frame house with a gable roof. The gable is ornamented with imbricated shingle and a circle motif around the cornice, and has a three part window. There are three bays and a one story porch on the front of the house. This porch is supported by Doric columns. In front of the second story end bay toward the north is a small balcony with a roof supported by turned posts and pierced brackets and a ballustrade. There is a triangular pediment above this balcony. Still standing in front of this house is a gas lamp on a post.

313 Mill Street

In 1892 Governor Henry Lloyd (see 701 Locust Street) purchased two acres of land, including what is now 311-315 Mill street, from one of the heirs of Dr. Alexander Hamilton Bayly (see 207-213 High Street.) Lloyd sold the corner lot, 311 Mill Street, to Alonzo L. Miles, and in 1895 built houses on the 313 and 315 lots. The house at 313 Mill Street was intended for Lloyd's two unmarried sisters, Kate and Mary. The property remained in the Lloyd family until sold to the present owners in 1952.

This home is one of the several vernacular dwellings on Mill Street built around the turn of the century. It is very similar to 315 Mill Street; it is probable that both buildings were originally identical and have been altered by late owners.


