DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This large two and one half story frame house is an example of the Queen Anne style architecture, although it lacks the elaborate detail or "gingerbread" that is usually associated with this style. The main portion of this house is a three bay rectangular block with a hip roof. Added to this on the northeast corner is a three story circular tower with a tall cone shaped roof. This roof and the main roof are both built of slate. Across the front and part of the side of the house is a one story porch, supported by Doric columns, with a gabled pediment in front of the door. Over the two end bays toward the south, on the front, is a gable with a Palladian window. On both the north and south facades is a gable over a two story polygonal bay window.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is significant as an example of Queen Anne style architecture. It is one of the older and more architecturally significant houses on Oakley Street, which consists of many large houses of early 20th century construction. It was built around 1902 by E. Milton Skinner, who at that time owned this whole block of Oakley Street, along with his son, Edgar M. Skinner. Mr. Skinner and his son were also co-owners of E. M. Skinner, Wholesale Grocers, the first wholesale grocers on the Eastern Shore. This was the first house to be built on this block of Oakley Street which was at that time rural in character. Edgar Skinner built the second house on this block, 111.




