DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house bears similarities to others on Oakley Street, which were probably built by the same contractor William Thomas. It is almost identical to 106 Oakley Street. It has a hip roof that rises to a ridge with a center chimney, and on each side of the roof is a large gabled dormer with a Palladian window. The front facade is two bays long. In front of these two bays, and also extending around part of the north and south facades, is a one story porch supported by Doric columns with a plain ballustrade between the columns. In front of the door, extending beyond the porch, is a gabled pediment supported by two additional Doric columns. On the south is a gable over a two story polygonal bay window, and on the north is another gable over projecting bays.


